If you desire to plan for weekly lessons, start the calendar year off with lessons about "Jesus' Ministry" up to Easter. Continue with "New Testament Missions" until the end of spring. During the summer study "World Missions" and in the fall study the "The Old Testament To Jesus' Birth".

Important Teacher Preparation

Always preview the lesson video <u>before</u> you present it to your students. Each group of students is different and they may need some additional help <u>before</u> they see the video. The video may contain words or concepts that your children need help to understand. Make notes of the words and take time to define the them. Give an example of their use so that the students can grasp an important theme in the story. Also, take time to explain special customs of Biblical times. For example, people in Western culture do not generally offer sacrifices like in Biblical times and this is an important practice to understand. Consider purchasing a Children's Bible Dictionary to help you in this important task.

Yo! Game Directions

These directions can also be found in video format at the YoPlace.org web site home page.

The Yo-game is a fun and exciting educational way to reinforce the YoPlace lesson each week.

Here's how you play the Yo-game:

At the start of class each player is given ONE game sheet and one Yobill for attending.

The Yo-game sheet is played in a similar manner to Bingo and Tic-Tack-Toe.

Each game sheet has a series of letters on them.

The series of letters is different on most of the sheets.

Only the sheets which have the same picture in the upper right hand corner are identical.

Generally speaking it is best if each player has a different game sheet and therefore a different picture.

Start the lesson with playing part one of the video. During the video, when you see the circular text reading "Pause for questions" on the screen, pause the video and proceed to ask Part 1 questions. The video Bible story or lesson is separated into five parts, in the same way that the game questions are divided into five parts. After the questions have been asked and the answers given, proceed with video sections two through five in the same manner as the first part.

ONLY game players raising their hands and called on by the teacher, will qualify to answer the question. If a player called on to answer the question gives the wrong answer, another player can be asked to try. When a player answers the question correctly, then without looking into the bag, they will pick out one letter. If no one can answer the question, the teacher can answer the question and pick one letter out of the bag. The letter chosen out of the bag is announced by the teacher and then placed face up on the table for all to see. All players with that same letter on their game sheet can color in that letter.

There is at least one "Instant Yo!" piece in the letter bag. The person that draws the "Instant Yo!" piece wins one Yo-bill and they also get to pick another letter.

No player should color in a letter that has not been chosen out of the letter bag.

When a player has three colored letters that form a straight line across - down - or diagonally on the game sheet, they win. Players that win can continue to play for additional wins.

The moment a player has a winning combination of three straight letters they should call out "Yo!" and immediately receive one Yobill from the teacher.

As the game is played, the possibility of more winners becomes greater. If the game players get too noisy with excitement, the game should be paused until it quiets down.

There are a couple of letters and one symbol that is common on all sheets. The letters "Y", "O", and exclamation mark are on all the sheets and in the same position. If these three are called during the game then everyone is a winner of that combination and everyone receives one Yo-bill.

The Yo-game is finished when all the questions are asked or the lesson time has come to an end.

At the end of class players may trade in their Yo-bills for rewards. Rewards may be candy, toys, stickers, badges and other creative items.

Special Note: Bible questions are more easily answered when referencing the New American Standard Bible.

Yo! HAVE FUN!

Note: You may decide to give rewards (Yo! Bills) to students that do extra credit each week. Such as:

Memorizing a Bible verse that is applicable to the lesson

A good volunteer reader

Doing a good job in coloring in the lesson coloring page

Helping to set up before class or helping to clean up after class

Helping with the Yo! Game

Being very cooperative, quiet and attentive during the Yo! Game

Bringing a new visitor to class

Old Testament - Creation - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

In the creation of our known world what was the first thing God created? Light

The method we use to create is different than the method God uses.. How does God create? With His Word.

Have a volunteer read John 1:1. What was the Word according to this passage? *The Word was God.*

Have a volunteer read John 1:14. Who is this verse talking about? *The Lord Jesus Christ.*

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

What two things did God make on the third day? He made dry land and created all kinds of plants.

Even before God created Man and animals He was preparing what for them? A supply of wonderful food.

Have a volunteer read 1 Peter 1:20-21. Before God made man He knew they would sin and they would die. Who was there before the foundations of the world? *Our Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ.*

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

What day did God create the creatures of the sea and the birds of the air? **The fifth day.**

What day did God create the sun, moon and the stars? *The fourth day.*

Refer to Genesis 1:22. What did God do after He made the creatures of the sea and air? He blessed them.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

What did God create on the sixth day? All the land creatures and man (male and female).

Refer to Genesis 1:26. God created man in whose image? "God created man in His own image"

Refer to Genesis 1:29-30. Did God originally intend man and animals to eat flesh as meat?

No, He gave man and animals fruit, seeds, and greens to eat. They were vegetarians.

What is the common thing that God said each day of creation? It is good.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

What did God do on the seventh day? He rested.

Refer to Genesis 2:3. What else did God do on the seventh day? He blessed and sanctified it.

Sanctified means to make holy, set apart as sacred not common like every other day.

The seventh day is called the Sabbath day. The Sabbath day is also one of the Ten Commandments from God.

Have a volunteer read Exodus 20:8-11. What is God asking us to do on the Sabbath (Seventh Day)? **Rest**

Old Testament - The Fall - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

What was man's job in the Garden of Eden? His job was to cultivate and take care of the garden.

What was the name of the one fruit tree that they were not supposed to eat from? *The tree of the knowledge of good and evil.*

What did God say would happen if they ate from that tree? "They would surely die."

Have a volunteer read John 3:16.

In our fallen world, many religions claim to be the way to God and eternal life. What did Jesus say? "...no one comes to the Father (God) but through Me"...

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

God said it is not good for man to live how ? Alone

What did Man call his new partner in life? Woman

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 10:24-25. What does God want us to do for each other? "...stimulate one another to love and good deeds...encouraging one another..."

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

The serpent was more <u>what</u> than any other beast of the field? **Crafty, cunning, deceitful or sly.**

The serpent told the woman if she eats the forbidden fruit ..." your eyes will be opened, and you will be like <u>whom</u>?" **God**

Have a volunteer read John 11:25-26.

Because they ate the forbidden fruit everyone is cursed to die. How did Jesus change this? "... he who believes in Me will live even if he dies..."

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

After they ate the forbidden fruit, Adam and Eve heard the sound of God walking in the garden. What did they do? *They hid themselves from God.*

Who did Adam blame for his eating the forbidden fruit? Adam blamed Eve.

Who did Eve blame for her eating the forbidden fruit? *The serpent.*

Adam and Eve use the same excuse we sometimes use for sin. What is it? **Blaming others for our actions.**

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

How did Adam and Eve's sin affect their relationship with God? *They were separated from Him.*

We now live in a cursed world. There is pain, sorrow and death in this world.

Have a volunteer read Revelations 21:4. For each correct answer one can pull a letter out of the bag. In heaven, what has God promised those who put their trust in Jesus as their Lord and Savior?

God will wipe away our tears.

There will be no more death.

No more sorrow or crying.

No more pain.

Former things are passed away.

Old Testament - Noah - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

When God looked on the earth and saw the wickedness of man what did He feel? He was grieved in His heart.

And he was sorry that He had made man.

Have a volunteer read Genesis 6:8-9. How was Noah different than the other men on earth? He was righteous (right with God), blameless in his time and walked with God.

Have a volunteer read Isaiah 64:6. God looks down and views our good works as what? Filthy cloths.

Have a volunteer read Galatians 3:27. How can we look clean to God? We can clothe ourselves with Christ.

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

What was the ark made of and covered with? It was made of Gopher wood and covered with pitch.

What were the only people to be on the ark? Noah, his wife, his sons and their wives.

How old was Noah when he was done with the ark? (Genesis 7:6) He was six hundred years old.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

God was not only concerned with saving some people, but also saving what? Some of every living creature.

The animals were to come in twos. What did they have in common? *One was male and one was female.*

How many sons did Noah have? Three; Shem, Ham and Japheth.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

How many days did the flood waters come upon the earth? Forty days.

Did the waters rise above the tallest mountains? Yes, fifteen cubits above the tallest mountains.

Did the people of Noah's day recognize that the flood and judgment was coming? **No**

Have a volunteer read Matthew 24:38-42. For each correct answer one may pick a letter out of the bag. What does the time before the flood and the time before Jesus return have in common?

(Verse 38) "... They were eating and drinking..."

(Verse 38) "...marrying and given in marriage..." (not realizing the end time was near)

(Verse 39) "...they did not understand..." until it was too late.

Will we know when the Lord Jesus returns? No we will not know. so be on the alert!

PART 5 QUESTIONS:


When Noah and his family got off the ark what is the first thing he did?

Built an alter and gave a sacrificial thank offering to the Lord.

God promised to never flood the earth again. What was the sign of His covenant or agreement with us? *The rainbow. We remember God will never destroy all mankind with a flood again.*

The Lord Jesus Christ made a covenant or promise with us. What was the sign of the New Covenant?

Communion. We remember that Jesus sacrificed His life for us. So that if we believe in Him, We will live forever with Him, from today and into eternity.



Old Testament - Abram - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Have everyone turn in their Bibles to Genesis 12:1-3

God has asked a man called Abram to do some amazing things and God has made some amazing promises.

What three things did God ask Abram to leave? His country, His relatives and his home (father's house).

Where is he asking Abram to go? To the land which God will show him.

God has promised to bless Abram. What kind of nation will he make from Abram? A great nation.

If anyone curses Abram and his people what will happen? They will be cursed.

In Abram what will happen to the families of the earth? They will be blessed! (The Lord Jesus Christ)

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Abram took Lot with him to the new land. How was Lot related to Abram? Lot was Abram's nephew.

Lot and Abram had to separate. Which land did Lot decide to live in? The fertile Jordan Valley.

Abram was high on a mountain and God asked him to look in all directions and God promised Abram <u>what</u>? **God promised to give the land to Abram and to his descendants forever.**

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

What happened to Lot and the people in the valley? *They got conquered and dragged away by a enemy.*

Have a volunteer read Deuteronomy 31:6. How would this verse encouraged Abram to save Lot? "Be strong and courageous...for the Lord your God is the one who goes with you."

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

How successful was Abram in rescuing Lot and the captives? Very successful.

On the way back Abram met king and priest Melchizedek of Salem.

As a thanks offering to God what did Abram give the priest Melchizedek? One tenth of all.

What did the king and priest Melchizedek do for Abram? He blessed Abram.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

After these things the word of the Lord came to Abram in a vision. God said I am a what to you? **Shield**

God asked him to look up and if he could, count the <u>what</u>? **Stars**

Why did God want Abram to try to count the stars in the heavens?

God wanted to give Abram an idea of how many descendants God would bless Abram with.

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 11:1. Why would God consider Abram faithful?

Because of God's promises, Abram had the assurance of things hoped for and the conviction of things not yet seen.

Old Testament - Abraham - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Abram was known for being wealthy, brave but most importantly he was a man of what ? Faith in God.

Why did it seem so impossible for Sarai and Abram to have children? **Because they were so old.**

Have a volunteer read 2 Peter 3:9. What does this verse say about God's time in completing a promise. He is not slow as some count slowness. An important part of faith is waiting on God.

Sarai can't wait for God so she tells Abram to have a child with what woman? *Hagar, Sarai's servant.*

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Abram successfully had a son with Hagar. His first son's name was whom? Ishmael

How did Sarai react to Hagar after Ishmael was born? She was jealous and treated Hagar poorly.

God blessed Abram's son Ishmael and he became the father of what great people? The Arab people.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

God changed Sarai's name to Sarah and blessed her. God said she would be the mother of what? Nations

God also said that one year from that time, ninety year old Sarah will have what? A child.

Having faith means to know in your heart and mind that nothing is too difficult for <u>who</u>? **God**

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Sarah had a son in one year and what did she name him? Isaac

God tested Abraham's faith and trust in Him. What did God ask Abraham to do?

Offer Isaac up as a burnt offering.

On the way Isaac asked Abraham where the lamb for the burnt offering was. What did Abraham reply? "God will provide for Himself the lamb for the burnt offering, my son."

Have a volunteer read John 1:29.

How did God provide a lamb for us? A sacrifice that paid the penalty for our sins?

The Lord Jesus Christ willingly sacrificed his life to save us from death and give us eternal life.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

God stopped Abraham from sacrificing his son. God then said, "for now I know that you what God,?" Fear

Does this fear of God mean to run away scared to death from God?

No. This fear means to respect, honor, serve and love with your whole heart and mind.

Have a volunteer read Psalm 33:18. Who does the Lord look upon? *Those who fear Him.*

Have a volunteer read Psalm 103:17. Who does the Lord give His loving kindness to? *Those who fear Him.*

Have a volunteer read Psalm 111:10. Who is truly wise? *The one who fears the Lord.*

Old Testament - Jacob - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Abraham's son Isaac had twin sons. What were their names? Jacob and Esau

Traditionally the birthright (blessing) went to the oldest son. In this case who should get the birthright? *Esau*

How did Jacob have Esau promise to give him the blessing?

Esau was hungry after hunting and he traded the birthright for Jacob's stew.

How does this show that Esau did not correctly value the birthright and God's blessing?

He valued a temporary desire for contentment over a future blessing from God.

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

When Isaac was old he wanted to pass on the blessing to Esau. Who came up with the plan to trick Isaac into giving the blessing to Jacob's mother Rebekah.

The trick worked and Jacob got the blessing. Was Esau upset when he didn't get it? **Yes, He wanted to kill Jacob.**

This is a very appropriate example of how sin causes <u>what</u>? **Separation of people and family.**

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Rabekah says goodbye to her son Jacob who she will never see again. Where does she send Jacob? *To her old family home in Haran.*

On the journey Jacob sleeps outdoors. What does he see going up and down from heaven? **Angels**

Have everyone turn to Genesis 28:10-15. God speaks to Jacob. Have the students take turns trying to name one promise that God is giving Jacob. For each correct answer the student can pick a letter.

(Verse 13) God will give him and his descendants the land that he rests on.

(Verse 14) Your descendants will be too many to number and will spread in all directions.

(Verse 14) The families of the earth will be blessed through you. Jesus will be your descendant.

(Verse 15) I will never leave you. I will be with you where ever you go.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Jacob arrived at Haran and ended up living there for how many years? 14 Years

Rabekah's brother Laban tricked Jacob into marrying his daughter Leah before he married who? *Rachael*

God blessed Jacob so that he became wealthier than who? His father in-law Laban.


God told Jacob it was time to go home to the Promised Land. What was Jacob concerned about? *His brother Esau's hatred for him.*

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

The night before Jacob met his brother Esau, he spent the whole night at what activity? Wrestling

Jacob asked for a blessing from his opponent. The opponent gave him what new name? Israel

After the wrestling match, who did Jacob believe he was wrestling with? **God**



Old Testament - Joseph - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Last week we learned about Jacob. Do you remember the new name God gave him? Israel

Why was Israel afraid to meet his brother Esau? The last time Esau saw him he wanted to kill him.

During the reunion of Israel and Esau, what was the name of Israel's youngest son? **Joseph**

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

After Benjamin was born how many sons did Israel have? **Twelve**

Israel's favorite son was Joseph. What did he give Joseph to honor him? A varicolored tunic or coat.

Joseph had a dream that concerned his brothers and sheaves of grain. Explain the dream.

He and his brothers bound sheaves of grain. All his brothers sheaves bowed to Joseph's grain.

Joseph had another dream that involved the sun, moon and stars. Explain this dream.

The sun and the moon and eleven stars were bowing down to Joseph.

This means that his whole family including his mom and dad bowed down to Joseph.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Why did many of Joseph's brothers want to kill him? *Their jealousy turned into an evil hatred.*

Have a volunteer read James 3:16. According to this verse. What happens when people are jealous. *There is disorder and every evil thing.*

What is the name of the brother that persuaded the others not to kill Joseph? **Reuben**

What was the name of the brother that suggested they sell Joseph to the Ishmaelites? **Judah**

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Joseph was sold in Egypt to Potiphar. Potiphar's wife lied to Potiphar and told him that Joseph tried to hurt her. How did Potiphar punish Joseph? *He had Joseph thrown into prison.*

Pharaoh had a bad dream. He wanted it interpreted. With God's help a convict in Pharaoh's prison could tell him what the dream meant. What was the name of the convict? **Joseph**

Pharaoh was so pleased with Joseph's interpretation and honored him by doing what?

Pharaoh made Joseph second in command of Egypt; only Pharaoh was greater than Joseph.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Years later what brought Joseph's brothers down to Egypt? *They were hungry and wanted to buy food.*

When the sons of Israel saw Joseph did they recognize him? *No, they thought Joseph was Egyptian.*

What did the brothers do that made Joseph's childhood dream come true? *They bowed to Joseph*

Before Joseph revealed himself to his brothers what did he do? He tested them to see if they changed.

Have a volunteer read Genesis 45:4-5.

Joseph felt that God used the hardship and the blessings that he had to do <u>what</u>? Preserve life. Preserve Joseph's family (the children of Israel) from the famine.

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Why did Israel leave Canaan and take all his sons, daughters and grandchildren to live in Egypt?

To escape the famine and be with Joseph.

Before Israel died he asked his family to promise to bury him where? Back in the promised land - Canaan

What country occupies the land of Canaan today? Israel

How old was Joseph when he died? He lived to be one hundred and ten years old.

How many years were the descendents of Israel to live in Egypt? *Four hundred years*.

God is powerful and keeps His what? **Promises or Word.**

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Why was the ruler (Pharaoh) concerned about the Children of Israel?

Because they had grown more and mightier than the Egyptians.

What was the first thing Pharaoh tried to do to control the Children of Israel?

He made their lives bitter with hard labor making mortar and bricks and at all kinds of labor in the field.

Next Pharaoh tried to stop the Children of Israel from becoming more numerous by doing what? Having every Hebrew baby boy killed by casting them into the Nile River.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Even when there is an evil ruler over people, who is more powerful and in control? **God**

How many months did Moses' mother hide him in their home? *Three months.*

Who followed the baby Moses to find out where he would end up? *Moses' sister*.

Who ended up nursing and raising the baby Moses getting paid for it? *Moses' real mother.*

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Why did Moses defend the Hebrew from the violent Egyptian? *He knew the slave was one of his brethren.*

Why did Pharaoh want to kill Moses? *Moses killed an Egyptian in the process of protecting a slave.*

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 11:24-27. Why did Moses' faith make him not want to be called the son of Pharaoh's daughter? *Moses' faith enabled him to see greater reward beyond Egypt in heaven.*

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Where did Moses flee to excape Pharaoh? *Midian*

How old was Moses when he left Egypt? Forty years old.

How long was Moses a shepherd in the wilderness of Midian? *Forty years.*

How many years did the Children of Israel or Hebrews live in Egypt? Four hundred years.

Old Testament - Moses 2 - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

How many years did Moses live as a part Pharaoh's household and how many years did he spend as a shepherd? He was 40 years in Pharaoh's household and 40 years as a shepherd.

Why did God ask Moses to take his sandals off? Because the ground that he was standing on was holy.

What is the first thing God is going to do for the Children of Israel? *Deliver them from the Egyptians.*

What is the second thing God is going to do for the Children of Israel? Bring them to a better land.

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Have a volunteer read Matthew 23:12. What happens to the person who puts themselves ahead of others? *They well be put behind by God.*

(Numbers 12:3) Moses was more <u>what</u> than any other man on earth? He was more humble than any other man.

Who is known for not being humble and having a hard heart? **Pharaoh**

Have a volunteer read 1 Peter 5:5-6. What does God want us to be with each other? **Be humble toward one another, because God is against the proud.**

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Pass out this weeks coloring page. You, as the teacher, think of one of the plagues. The first child to think of the plague you are thinking about gets to pull a letter out of the bag.

The last plague over the land of Egypt is different because it could also hurt what people?

The Children Of Israel (Hebrews) also if they do not follow the specific instructions of God given through Moses.

With regard to the last plague, If any household did not follow God's specific instructions for the Passover night what would happen? *The first born in that family would die.*

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

To protect their home during the last plague what did each family have to sacrifice? *A lamb*.

Where did the lamb's blood have to be put? The blood was to be put on the two door post and lintel.

Have a volunteer read Ephesians 1:7. Someday we all face judgement, what will protect us from the penalty of sins which is death? **The blood of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.**


PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Why did Moses ask the Jews (Children of Israel) to be prepared to leave after eating the Passover meal?

Because God knew that Pharaoh would tell them all to leave after the last plague.

What are the 3 different names for the people that God was leading out of Egypt and making into a nation? Children of Israel, Hebrews, Jews



Old Testament - Moses 3 - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Why didn't God lead the Children by the shortest route to Canaan where He wanted to settle them?

Because it meant they would travel through the land of the Philistines. Then if they were threatened with war they may return to Egypt.

How did God lead the people by day and by night?

He lead them with a pillar of cloud by day and a pillar of fire by night.

Have a volunteer read 1 Samuel 17:47. This verse says that the Lord does not deliver by what? **Sword or spear.**

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

How did God prevent the Egyptian army from overtaking the Children of Israel? He stalled them with thick dark fog.

How did God separate the Red Sea? With a strong east wind all night.

Miriam (Moses sister) sang: "You have led the people whom You have redeemed". Redeem means to buy back, to free from distress or harm. How has Jesus redeemed us? *The penalty for sin is death.*Jesus paid the penalty for our sins by dieing on the cross for us. He set us free from death.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Who did God want to be king over the nation of Israel? God, Himself.

God wanted to do more than make the nation of Israel big. He wanted them to be a <u>what</u> nation? **Holy**

He wanted the people to be holy priesthood that would be set apart to do what? **Serve and worship God.**

Have a volunteer read 1 Peter 2:9. God calls Christians a Holy people. What does He want Christians to do? "...proclaim the excellencies of Him who has called you out of darkness into His marvelous light"

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

In answering the following have everyone open their Bibles to Exodus 20:3-17 Which one of God's commandments includes a blessing if you obey it?

5 - Honor your father and mother, that your days may be prolonged...

Which two of the ten commandments did the people disobey even as Moses came down the mountain?

1 - You shall have no other gods before Me and 2- you shall not make yourselves idols.

Because of a lack of faith, how many years did the Children of Israel wander in the wilderness? Forty years.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Have everyone look up Psalm 105:3-5 and answer the following with the verse reference. How should our heart be when we seek the Lord? *Glad and rejoicing with praise. (3)*

Who should we get our strength from? The Lord. (4)

How often should we seek the Lord? Continually or all of the time. (4)

What should we remember? The works or wonders that He has done. (5)

Old Testament - Joshua - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

What was the title that God gave Moses? Servant

What was the name of the next leader of the Children of Israel or Hebrews? Joshua

Three times God encouraged Joshua to be what? **Be strong and courageous!**

What did God request Joshua and the people meditate on day and night? God's law and Word.

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

What is the name of the woman who hid the two Hebrew spies in Jericho? *Rahab*

What did Rahab say concerning God and the land? "I know that the LORD has given you the land,.."

What miracle had Rahab heard about that happened forty years ago to the Hebrews?

God parted the Red Sea and the Children of Israel passed through it on dry ground.

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 11:31. According to this verse why didn't Rahab perish with the rest of Jericho? *She had FAITH that the one true God was with the Hebrews and she helped them.*

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

When did the Jordan waters rise up into a great heap? When the priest feet dipped in the edge of the water.

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 9:4. What did the Ark Of The Covenant have in it? "a golden jar holding the manna, and Aaron's rod which budded, and the tablets of the covenant:"

Where did God ask the priest to stand with the Ark Of The Covenant as the people crossed the Jordan? *In the middle of the dry river bed.*

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Why do you think Rahab was not surprised that the Jordan waters cleared away for the Hebrews?

She remembered that God also cleared a path for the Hebrews to go through the Red Sea.

How many days did the Children of Israel march around Jericho? Seven Days.

When was the last time Joshua encouraged the Children of Israel to enter the promised land? *Forty years ago.*

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

How many times did the Hebrew soldiers march around Jericho on the seventh day? Seven times.

Have a volunteer read 1 Corinthians 1:18. What is meant by the word of the cross?

This is the "Good News" the "Gospel" message that God saves by faith not by works.

Why would the "word of the cross is foolishness to those who are perishing"?

Many people would prefer to be saved by their good works rather than believing in Jesus as their Lord and Savior.

Old Testament - Deborah - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Years before, Moses told the Children of Israel that they should always keep what? God's commandments.

Moses also warned them that when they grew wealthy and proud then they would forget who? **God.**

Instead of God what did the Hebrews (Children of Israel) worship? *Idols. False gods*.

At this time in history, did the Hebrews (Children of Israel) have an earthly king? No, God was to be their King.

What was the name of the Hebrew leaders that helped to guide the people? **Judges.**

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Because the Hebrews forgot to love the living God what happened? *They suffered under the Canaanites*.

The Canaanites were a strong military army. How many iron chariots did they have? 900

The people prayed to God for help. In those days, there was a women prophetess and judge. What was her name? **Deborah**

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Who did Barak the new leader of the Hebrews go to for directions? **Deborah**

Deborah gave Barak battle instructions from God. Barak did not want to go without who? **Deborah**

Deborah agreed to go with him. Because Barak's refused to go to battle without Deborah, the honor for defeating the mighty Canaanite general Sisera will go into the hands of who? *A woman.*

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Barak took his men to Mount Tabor. Where did General Sisera take his men? To valley of the river Kishon.

How did God cripple the mighty Canaanite army and its chariots? With a storm and flood of water.

Did the evil Canaanite general Sisera die or escape from the battle? **He escaped.**


PART 5 QUESTIONS:

General Sisera escapes from the battle. Where does he try to hide? *In the tent of Jael.*

What does Jael give Sisera to help him to relax and go to sleep? A blanket and a drink of milk.

After the victory Barak and Deborah celebrated by singing praise to who? **God.**



Old Testament - Samuel - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Why was Hannah so upset? She was married for a time and still did not have any children.

Was her husband Elkanah able to comfort her? He tried unsuccessfully.

Hannah asked God to give her a son, and if He did, then what would she do as thanks to God? "I will give him to the LORD all the days of his life".

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Every year Samuel's parents would come to the tabernacle to worship God, see Samuel, and bring him <u>what</u>?

**A robe or coat.

Eli the priest blessed Samuel's parents and they had how many more children? *Three sons and two girls*.

Samuel grew to be a priest, judge and prophet. The Bible says none of his words failed. What does that mean?

The Lord was with him. The Lord gave him the words to say, therefore they were always true.

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Did Samuel have children? Yes, and the people did not want Samuel's children to take Samuel's place.

What else did the people ask Samuel for? A King to rule over them like other nations.

God told Samuel that the people had not rejected Samuel but had rejected who? God

Have a volunteer read 1 Samuel 8:10-17 (Samuel's warning about what a King would do to them.)

Each person can choose a letter for naming something that the King would do to the people.

- (verse 11) Take your sons for warfare.
- (verse 12) Appoint people to make things for him.
- (verse 13) Take your daughters for entertainment, and cooks.
- (verse 14-15) Take one tenth of the food you raise for his officers and servants.
- (verse 16) He will take your servants and animals to work for him.
- (verse 17) He will take a tenth of your flocks and you will become his servants.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Have a volunteer read 1 Samuel 10:18-19. What has God done for His people?

Each person can choose a letter for naming something that God has done for Israel.

- (verse 18) God delivered the people from the oppression of Egypt and other kingdoms.
- (verse 19) God delivered them from calamities and distresses. Calamities, like people invading their land and stealing their positions. Distresses like drought and famine.

What was the name of the first king of Israel? Saul

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

How did Saul disobey God when he fought the Amalekites?

After he defeated them, he saved the spoils of war. He was supposed to destroy it all.

As a weak excuse for disobeying the Lord, Samuel said he was going to sacrifice the spoils to honor God. Samuel said to obey God is better than <u>what</u>? **Sacrifice**

Disobeying God is VERY serious. How did God punish Saul for this sin? God rejected Saul as king.

Old Testament - David - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

God sent Samuel to Jesse's family to choose a new king from his sons. Where did Jesse live? **Bethlehem**

Have a volunteer read 1 Samuel 16:7. When judging someone, what does God look at? *The heart.*

When Samuel was looking over Jesse's sons where was David? He was in the fields with the sheep.

In anointing David to be King what did Samuel anoint David with? Oil

What does the oil represent? It represents the Spirit of God

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

David knows that God has chosen him to be the next king.. Does he try to overthrow King Saul? **No**

What is the name of the giant that insults King Saul's soldiers? Goliath the Philistine.

Have a volunteer read Psalm 56:3-4. Where does David put his trust? *In God.*

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Why did David go to the battle front? His dad asked him to bring food to his brothers who were soldiers.

David called the army of Saul "the army of the what God"? The army of the living God.

When David met Saul what did he volunteer to do? Go and fight Goliath.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Did Saul believe David was able to fight Goliath? No he felt David was too young and inexperienced.

David told Saul that he had killed both a Lion and a what ? Bear

Have a volunteer read 1 Peter 5:8. Why does this verse warn us to be careful, sober and vigilant?

Because our adversary the Devil hunts around like a roaring lion seeking someone to devour.

David said that the Lord delivered him from the lion and the bear, and He would deliver him from Goliath.

What does he mean by the Lord will "deliver" me? *It means to free or to save.*

Our Lord Jesus Christ is the only One who can deliver us from what? *Evil and the penalty of sin - death.*

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

David killed Goliath with a sling and a <u>what</u>? **Stone**

More than that, what in David enabled him to fight the giant? Faith in the all powerful Living God.

Have a volunteer read Psalm 18:1-3

(verse 1) - What does the Lord provide David? Strength

(verse 2) - To David the Lord is what? The Lord is his rock, fortress, deliverer, shield and salvation.

(verse 3) - How does David thank the Lord? He gives Him praise!

Old Testament - Elijah - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

After David and Solomon were Kings of Israel the nation split into two. What were the names of the two parts? *Israel and Judah.*

The northern kingdom was ruled by a bad king and wicked queen. What were their names? Ahab and Jezebel.

Have a volunteer read Hebrews 12:5-6. Who does the Lord discipline? *Those He loves.*

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

Who did King Ahab blame the drought on? *Elijah*

Could people turn on Christians and blame them for the trouble they are experiencing?

Yes. In the past and today in many places Christians are being blamed for trouble in the world.

Why did Elijah blame Ahab for the drought? Because Ahab turned away from God to worship idols.

One of the idols worshiped was Asherah. What was the name of the other idol? Baal

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

What was the problem with the children of Israel that Elijah was trying to resolve?

The people could not decide what god to worship, the idols or the Living God.

What was the name of the mountain that everyone was to meet at? Mt. Carmel

The competition involved a sacrifice. What was the one thing no one could add to the sacrifice? Fire

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

How long did the Baal priest call out to Baal to send fire on their sacrifice? *From morning until the evening.*

How many stones did Elijah use to build the altar? Twelve stones - one for each son of Jacob

There was a drought in Israel, but what did Elijah command be put all over the altar? WATER - three times!

God sent fire to burn the sacrifice. What else did it burn? *The wood, stones and water.*

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

After the sacrifice Elijah told King Ahab to go and do what? Eat, because rain was coming.

Elijah and his servant went to the top of Mt. Carmel to watch for rain. How many times did Elijah ask the servant to go back and look for a sign of rain? **Seven times.**

On the seventh time the servant said he saw something. What did he say it looked like? *A cloud as big as a man's fist.*

Have a volunteer read Exodus 34:14. What does this tell us about God.

He is jealous. He wants our attention and worship.

Have a volunteer read Deuteronomy 4:24. How does this part of God's character relate to this Bible story?

God is powerful. He can consume or destroy with fire.

God is jealous. He wants you to love Him and not other gods.

Old Testament - Daniel - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Many times the kings and people of Israel turned from worshiping God to worshiping idols. What people did God send to tell the people to turn back to Him? *The Prophets*

What is the name of one of the last great prophets? **Jeremiah**

Jeremiah knew because of their sin the people would be carried away to what country? **Babylon**

Have a volunteer read Jeremiah 45:28. Why did God tell the people not to fear going to Babylon? **Because God promised to be with them and not bring a full end to their people.**

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

One young Jew who was taken to Babylon became a leader of the Babylonians. What was his name? **Daniel**

Besides being a great leader in Babylon Daniel is known as being a great what ? Prophet

What was the first name of the King of Babylon that Daniel served? King Nebuchadnezzar

Have a volunteer read Psalm 119:105. What helps guide us into the future? **God's word.**

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

King Darius liked Daniel. Why did other high officials dislike Daniel? *They were jealous of him.*

The jealous officials decided to have the king sign a law that no one could petition (pray) to anyone outside the king for how many days? **30 days.**

In presenting this law to the king, how did the officials lie? They said all the officials agreed to the new law.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

The evil officials caught Daniel disobeying the new law. How many times a day did Daniel petition (pray) to God. *Three times a day.*

The king was upset that his friend Daniel was to be punished. Why didn't the king simply change the law?

**After a king makes a law, according to the law of the Medes and Persians, it may not be revoked.

Have a volunteer read 2 Corinthians 1:8-10. The apostle Paul was used to facing death. Where did he place his hope of deliverance? *The God that raises the dead, the Lord Jesus Christ.*

Have a volunteer read Daniel 6:16. Who did the king hope would deliver Daniel? **The God of Daniel**.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

King Darius was thrilled that Daniel's God saved Daniel from the lions. What happened to the evil officials? *They were the lion's breakfast.*

Have everyone turn in their Bibles to Daniel 6:26-28. According to King Darius' decree answer the following. According to verse 26 what is Daniel's God like?

He is a Living God, enduring forever and His kingdom will never be destroyed.

According to verse 27 what is God's character like?

He delivers, He rescues and performs signs and wonders in heaven and on earth.

Jesus' Birth - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

Daniel lived approximately how many years before Zacharias? Approximately 400 years.

What was a frustrating issue in Zacharias and his wife Elizabeth's marriage? *They had no children.*

Where was Zacharias when the angel Gabriel brought him good news?

As a priest he was in the temple bringing the people's prayers before God at the Altar of Incense.

PART 2 QUESTIONS: *It may be helpful to refer to Luke 1:28-38 in answering these questions.* The same angel that came to Zacharias went to Mary six months later. What was his name? *Gabriel*

Gabriel told Mary that the baby she was to have will be a boy named Jesus and be called Son of <u>who</u>? **Son of the Most High or Son of God.**

Gabriel also told Mary that Jesus would get whose throne? *His father David.* Note: as a human Jesus was a descendent of King David.

According to Gabriel, how long would Jesus rule as King last? *It would never end - forever!*

PART 3 QUESTIONS: It may be helpful to refer to Luke 1:39-55 in answering these questions. Mary traveled to a city called Judah to see a cousin. What was the cousin's name? **Elizabeth**

What happened to Elizabeth's baby in her womb, when the voice of Mary was heard? The baby leaped for joy.

Mary said from this time on all generations will count her as <u>what</u>? **Blessed**

Elizabeth called Mary the mother of her <u>what</u>? **The mother of her Lord.**

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Was Mary's future husband Joseph surprised when he heard she was pregnant? He was shocked!

An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream and told him not to be afraid to take Mary as his wife. He was told that they would have a son named Jesus who would save His people from what ? Sin

Jesus was born in the same city as what great man of the Bible? David

Another name that Jesus was to be called was Immanuel. What does Immanuel mean? God with us.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Have a volunteer read Luke 1:10-11. Who was the baby Jesus born for? *The shepherds and all people.*

Even as a baby the angels told the shepherds that the baby Jesus was <u>what</u>? **Savior and Lord.**

Have a volunteer read Luke 1:12. The shepherds were given a sign or clue as to how they could find the baby Savior and Lord in the crowded city of Bethlehem. What was the sign? *He was in a manger or barn.*

The Wise Men - Lesson Questions

Reword, add to or subtract from these questions as you feel appropriate for your students.

PART 1 QUESTIONS:

We are not sure, but it is thought that the wise men who came from the east came from what country? **Babylon**

What sign did the magi or wise men see that made them travel to Israel? *The unusual star in the heavens.*

When the magi arrived in Jerusalem what did they ask for? Directions to see the King of the Jews.

Without seeing the star, or hearing from the shepherds how did the chief priest and scribes know where the Messiah (Jesus) was to be born?

The Bible - The Prophet Micah (5:2) foretold of this event hundreds of years earlier.

When King Herod heard of Jesus' birth did he want to go worship him? *No, he wanted to kill him.*

PART 2 QUESTIONS:

The Magi left Jerusalem, toward Bethlehem. What led the men on to the place where Jesus was? *The star.*

The star led the Wise Men (Magi) to Israel. When they finally saw it again how did they react? With great joy!

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

What is the first thing the Wise Men did when they saw the Lord Jesus Christ? *They worshiped Him.*

The Wise Men reveal to us that God not only wants the Jews to worship the Lord Jesus Christ as King of Kings, but also <u>what</u> people? **All the rest of the people (Gentiles) of the world.**

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

How did the Magi know not to go back to Herod and tell him where Jesus was? God told them in a dream.

How did Joseph know not to flee to Egypt? An angel of the Lord appeared to Joseph in a dream.

When Herod learned that the Magi had tricked him what did Herod do?

He had all the Bethlehem male children two years and younger killed.

Have a volunteer read Ephesians 6:10-12. What does this work of Herod show us?

We live in a spiritual battle that is dangerous. The enemy is powerful for harm.

With Bible in hand, have all students review Ephesians 6:13-18. In spiritual warfare what are we to do? For each correct answer a student may pick a letter our of the bag.

- (Verse 13) Take up the armor of God and stand firm.
- (Verse 14) Stand firm, Gird up your loins (strong supporting belt) with truth.
- (Verse 14) Put on the Breastplate of Righteousness (God's approval right with God).
- (Verse 15) Wear good shoes prepared to share the "Good News" (Romans 10:15).
- (Verse 16) Shield of Salvation (faith) to protect your life from Satan's attack.
- (Verse 17) Helmet of Salvation (faith) to protect and guard your mind.

He did not shout unclean and he went into a large gathering of people.

What does the word Testimony mean? To bring first hand authentic evidence of a fact.

The fact is that because of Jesus the leper is healed and the Priest can declare him what? **Clean**

Have a volunteer read Isaiah 64:6. According to this bible verse is anyone clean and without sin? **No one.**

Have a volunteer read Romans 6:23. Why is it a gift of God that we are saved?

Because we can not earn it and we do not deserve it.

Jesus Heals the Centurion's Slave - Lesson Questions

Who met Jesus as they walked to the centurian's home? **Some of the centurian's friends.**

Why didn't the centurion want Jesus to come into his home? He did not feel he was worthy of his presence.

The centurian had faith that Jesus could do what from a distance? Heal his slave.

Jesus was totally impressed with the centurion for what reason? Jesus was impressed with his great faith.



It is not uncommon for people to suffer. In today's story how many years did this man suffer? 38 years.

Have a volunteer read Psalm 37:6-8. According to these Bible verses:

We should rest in the Lord and do what? Wait patiently for Him.

This passage speaks of wicked people that may take advantage of us. How should we react? "Stop being angry! Turn from your rage! Do not lose your temper. It only leads to harm." (NLT)

Have a volunteer read Romans 12:12. According to this Bible verses: How should we react when we suffer? "Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer." (NIV)

PART 3 QUESTIONS:

Jesus words alone healed the lame man. God's words are powerful. What did Jesus tell him to do? "Get up, pick up your pallet and walk."

Have a volunteer read John 1:1-3. According to these Bible verses, what is God called in these verses? *The Word.*

What did He do according to these verses? Brought everything into being. He created all things.

Have a volunteer read John 1:14. According to these Bible verses:

When the Word became flesh, who is this talking about? The Lord Jesus Christ.

What does Jesus posses? Grace and truth.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Jesus healed the lame man. The Jews asked the lame man, who healed you? What did he say? I don't know.

These men were jealous of Jesus. Have a volunteer read James 3:16-17. According to these Bible verses: Where jealousy and selfish ambition exists, there is what? **Disorder and every evil thing.**


But the wisdom from above is what?

Pure, peaceable, gentle, reasonable, full of mercy and good fruits, unwavering, without hypocrisy.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

Afterwards Jesus found the once lame man in the temple. Jesus told him to stop what? **Sinning**

Why did the disciples discourage Jesus to go to Bethany? The Jews were seeking to stone Jesus.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Thomas said "let us also go to Bethany" so that we may what with Jesus? Die with Him.

When Jesus arrived in Bethany how many days had Lazarus already been in the tomb? Four days.

Mary and Martha were in deep grief. Even Jesus was upset. How do we know Jesus was deeply moved? The Bible says that "Jesus wept."

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

What was the first thing that Jesus asked for the people to do?

He asked that the stone that sealed up the tomb or cave be removed.

Martha warned Jesus that if they took away the stone what would happen?

They would be able to smell the dead body. That would be a terrible smell.

Before Jesus raised Lazarus from the dead what did He do? He prayed out loud.

Jesus said that Lazarus' illness and death would bring glory to who? God and the Son of God (John 11:4)

What does resurrection mean? **To bring what is dead back to life.**

Have a volunteer read John 11:25-26. According to this Bible verse we must do something to have eternal life. What is the all important thing we must do? **Believe in the Lord Jesus Christ.**

The first born inside the house would die.

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Jesus told his disciples when they went into Jerusalem they would meet a man carrying what?

A pitcher of water. This would normally be considered woman's work.

Why did Jesus tell his disciples to follow the man carrying the pitcher of water?

The man would lead them to the place where they would celebrate the Passover.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

At the Passover Jesus took some bread, broke it and said what? "This is my body that is broken for you..."

Jesus asked everyone to drink from His cup. What did it represent?

His shed blood of the covenant....for the forgiveness of sins.



As Jesus was being crucified He made a last request to His Father. Complete this statement: He said: "Father, forgive them, for they do not know what ..." "they are doing." Luke 23:34

The leaders of the people mocked Jesus on the cross. Complete this statement: They said: "He saved others let Him save who?" "himself if this is the Christ of God..." Luke 23:35

Of all the people at the crucifixion, who was the one who said "Truly this man was the Son of God!"? *The Roman Centurion*

PART 4 QUESTIONS:

Concerning to Hebrews 10:12: "He, having offered one sacrifice for sins for all time <u>did what</u>?


He (Jesus)... "SAT DOWN AT THE RIGHT HAND OF GOD,"

Jesus cares deeply for Peter and Jesus knows the hardships that Peter will face in his future. Even when we suffer hardships what does Jesus want us to do? *He wants us to follow Him. "Follow Me!"*

If we follow Jesus even in times of suffering, what will we continue to do? **Pray, read the Bible, love Him and others as He requested.**

According to Jesus why was He sent to the world?



Before Peter answered he was filled with what? The Holy Spirit

Who did Peter give credit to for this miracle? Jesus Christ the Nazarene

The rulers told them to not speak or teach at all in the name of Jesus. Did Peter and John agree to stop? **NO** "for we cannot stop speaking about what we have seen and heard"





In the prison at midnight, what were Paul and Silas doing? Singing praises to God.

What did the guard want to do? He wanted to kill himself.

PART 5 QUESTIONS:

What did Paul tell the guard?







What was the name of the ship John built with the help of fellow Christians? *The Messenger of Peace*


